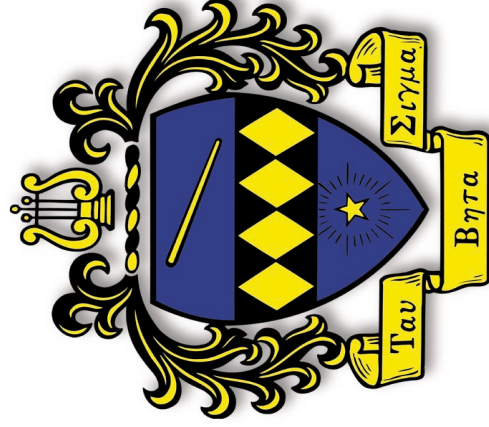

The *National Intercollegiate Band* brings together many of the best college musicians in the country to work under renowned conductors. The band premieres new works and performs other challenging literature at the opening of each biennial national convention.

The *Commissioning Program* has added significantly to the repertoire of the American concert band through the creation of works such as Robert Russell Bennett's "Symphonic Songs for Band" (1957), Karel Husa's "Concerto for Trumpet and Wind Orchestra" (1973), Fisher A. Tull's "Prelude & Double Fugue" (1979), and David Maslanka's "A Tuning Piece: Songs of Fall and Winter" (1995).
